### **Arrival & Departure:**

- 1. <u>Section 1:</u> Entries in this section (Classes 1 thru 45) are to be brought to the Dover Building between 9:00 AM and 12:00 Noon on Thursday, July 17.
- 2. <u>Section 2:</u> Entries in this section (Classes 46 thru 65) are to be brought to the Dover Building between 9:00 AM and 12:00 Noon on Thursday, July 17.
- 3. <u>Section 3:</u> Entries in this section (Classes 66 thru 112) are to be brought to the Dover Building between 9:00 AM and 12:00 Noon on Wednesday, July 23.
- 4. <u>Best Decorated Vegetable:</u> Entries must be brought to the Dover Building between 9:00 AM and 12:00 Noon on Thursday, July 17.
- 5. Judging will begin at 1:00 PM on Thursday, July 17 and at 1:00 PM Wednesday, July 23. Exhibitors are requested to remain outside the building while the judging of exhibits is in progress. The building will open to exhibitors as soon as judging is completed.
- 6. All Exhibits must be removed between 8:00 AM and 12:00 Noon on Sunday, July 27.

### **General Rules & Regulations:**

- 1. Entries can only be made online via the <u>Delaware State Fair's Website</u> beginning 9:00 AM April 1, 2025 thru 11:59 PM June 1, 2025.
- 2. Only one entry per exhibitor per class will be accepted. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 3. The Dover Building will open daily from 9:00 AM to 9:00 PM. (except when there is judging in the department). Exhibitors in this department are asked to read and observe the rules governing this department.
- 4. In order for the Delaware State Fair to better prepare for all exhibits, we ask that you only enter those classes which you will be able to complete and show at this year's fair.
- 5. Any and all premiums may be adjusted by The Delaware State Fair Board of Directors based on funding sources.

### **Department Rules & Regulations:**

- 1. Care will be taken to protect the exhibits from injury, but the Delaware State Fair will not be responsible in any way for accidents, loss and damage by water, fire, theft, or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss sustained. All exhibits are entered at the owner's risk.
- 2. Exhibitors must securely attach tags to their items with the assistance of Department Personnel. (Entries will not be accepted by department personnel until entry tags are securely affixed.)
- 3. On Thursday, July 17 or Wednesday, July 23, competitors who wish to deliver their entries to the Dover Building via car before 11:45 AM must do so by going to Exhibitor's Gate 2 (near the Quillen Arena) where they will be given a temporary permit that will allow them to drive to the Raughley Street entrance of the Dover Building. Your vehicle MUST BE REMOVED from the grounds and moved into the regular parking lot prior to 12:00 NOON.
- 4. With an effort toward keeping our garden vegetable display looking fresh for the duration of the Fair, we are again offering duplicate classifications for some classes. Please feel free to enter both classifications. Our only reminder is that if you enter Class No. 1 and Class No. 66, (Best Arranged Display) you are responsible for removing Class No. 1 before placement of Class No. 66.
- 5. Vegetables should be clean and free from dirt, however, do not scrub or damage the skin.
- 6. Peck basket exhibits must be entered in standard peck basket containers. Paper bags or other such containers will not be accepted.
- 7. The same vegetables entered in displays cannot compete for individual premiums.
- 8. Vegetables must be raised and owned by the exhibitor.
- 9. Vegetables must be grown in the current year.
- 10. All exhibits must be labeled with the name of the variety.
- 11. The Fair may withhold premium when exhibits are considered unworthy.
- 12. Ribbons won will be mailed following the Fair.
- 13. Exhibits become the property of the Delaware State Fair.
